1. File containing only the BODY OF THE ORIGINAL TEXT (Title, Abstract, Keywords, text, references and illustrations, when present, and other elements listed in item 1.1. of the Guidelines for Authors) to be transferred WITHOUT IDENTIFICATION OF THE AUTHORS, including the "Microsoft Word Properties".
2. If there are illustrations (figures, tables, charts or graphs), these should be inserted through the text, highlight the location of each one of them in the text, all properly numbered.
3. File containing only the TITLE PAGE, to be transferred as a SUPPLEMENTARY DOCUMENT, containing ALL the elements listed in item 1.2. of the Guidelines for Authors
4. **All the authors must be registered.** For each one of them is necessary to inform the full name, institutional affiliation, e-mail, abstract of the biography and ALL OTHER FIELDS of the electronic form must be fully completed during the submission process of the article.

The article with unprecedented characteristics must be drafted in Portuguese and sent exclusive to the Magazine e-science of the College of Juazeiro do Norte-FJN. The submission of the manuscript implies that the work in full or part(s) of it may not have been published in another source or vehicle of communication and that is not under consideration for publication in other journals.

In research involving human subjects, authors should send a copy of the approval issued by an ethics committee recognized by the National Committee for Ethics in Research (CONEP), according to the norms of Resolution N 510/2016 and N 466/2012 of the National Health Council - CNS or equivalent body in the country of origin of the research or a letter justifying the not sending the document referring to the Ethics Committee. The number of opinion must be contained in the method of the study.

1. STANDARDS FOR SUBMISSION OF MANUSCRIPT

1.1 General rules

- Manuscripts can be written in Portuguese or English with appropriate vernacular quality.
- The text must be typed on sheets of A4 paper size, in “doc” or “docx”, with spacing of 1.5 space (including the abstract) in **Times New Roman** font, size 12, and margin along the top, bottom and sides of 2.5 cm;
- References should follow the Vancouver Norms (see item 3);
- Figures
 - the digital images must be in JPG or TIFF format, in CMYK or tonalities of gray, with at least 7 cm in width and 300 dpi resolution.
 - the images should be sent in separate files.
 - if a figure has been published previously, its legend should give full credit to the original source.
 - all figures should be cited in the text.
- Graphs
 - must be sent files those contain the original versions of the graphics in the programs those have been used in their manufacture.
 - it is recommended to send them only in bitmap image format (non-editable).

- the drawings sent can be improved or redesigned by production of the magazine, at the discretion of the Editorial Board.
- the graphics should be cited in the text and numbered as Figures.
- Tables
 - tables should be self-explanatory and should complement, and not duplicate, the text.
 - should be numbered with Arabic numerals in the order in which they are mentioned in the text.
 - each table should contain a brief title.
 - if a table has been previously published, include a footnote giving credit to the original source.
 - introduce the tables as a text file (Word or Excel, for example), and not as graphic element (non-editable image).
- Figures, graphs and tables should be sent in additional files in the maximum number of 5;
- **Texts submitted in Portuguese:** when, after evaluation by peers, the original is recommended for publication, authors will provide the translation to the English language with specialized professionals accredited by the periodical; translation costs are borne by the authors.
- **Texts submitted in English:** when, after evaluation by peers, the original is recommended for publication, authors will provide the translation for the Portuguese language and the revision of the English version with specialized professionals accredited by the periodical; the costs of translation and revision shall be borne by the authors.
- Manuscripts from authors affiliated with institutions belonging to countries where English is the official language, these will be exempt from certification, which must be issued by accredited translators in the magazine.

1.2 Development of the manuscript

Front page

Cover Page: this page will not be considered for purposes of counts the total number of pages of the manuscript must include: Title, Identification of the category type sent and Authors.

Title: Concise, typed in upper case, bold, simple space and centralized. It should be presented a version of the title in English.

Note: If the submitted manuscript was originated from thesis, dissertation and thesis work (of course completion) must inform the banner as a footnote to the respective information: indicate the title, year and institution where it was presented. If it was presented at a scientific meeting, indicate the event name, place and date of completion.

Identification of the type of category submitted:

Editorial, Original Article, Review Article, Case Report/Case Series, Review or Reviews/Comments should be coupled to the right, upper case and bold.

Authors:

Full names, separated by commas, simple space between lines, centralized, governed numbers in Arabic numerals, sequential and overwritten, followed by a footnote, with the corresponding information for each author (Institution and email). By limiting the number of authors described above. Inform the author responsible for correspondence.

2. FORMATTING OF ARTICLES BY CATEGORIES

2.1 EDITORIAL:

It is intended that the discussion of several relevant topics or issues of own magazine. Usually ordered by the editors to researchers in specific areas.

2.2 ORIGINAL ARTICLE:

It is intended to disseminate the results of unpublished researches and allow repetition of the aforementioned methods.

Title

Clear and concise phrase identifying the content of the work.

Abstract

Submit an abstract between **100 and 250** words. Abstract of Original Article or Review article must contain: Introduction, Objective, Methods, Results and Conclusion. Summary of Report of Case/Case Series should be presented in the form of unstructured abstract to summarize the Introduction, objective and main points of the description and conclusion of the article.

Descriptors or Keywords: 3 to 5 appropriate words as guidelines of MeSH (www.nlm.nih.gov/mesh) and DeCS ([Http://decs.bvs.br/](http://decs.bvs.br/))

Abstract: Abstract in a **foreign language** (English)

Keywords: in **foreign language** (English)

1 Introduction

Inform about the object investigated properly problematized, clarify the relations with other studies in the area and show the relevance of the topic, the hypotheses (if applicable), the research question and the justification of their preparation and importance. And in this context, it should finish the section with the specification of the objective(s) of the article, clearly and briefly.

2 Method

Describe the procedures adopted - type of study, the investigated population, presenting the criteria of sample selection (inclusion and exclusion, if applicable), techniques and instruments of data collection, statistics and analysis of the data collected. Inform so those permit the reproducibility of the study, methods must be based on scientific studies. Submit references of methods, manufacturers of appliances and equipment and origin of materials used. It is noteworthy that must be included the number of protocol approval by the Committee for Ethics in Research, if applicable.

3 Results and Discussion

To present the results of the research in an objective way, describing the findings in a clear, concise and logical sequence, supported in the illustrations, as: Tables and Figures

(design, layout, flowchart, photographs, graphs, maps, instrument, among others). Should not be repeated in the text all the data in the tables and illustrations, only highlight the most important observations.

Interpret the results obtained by comparing them with other scientific articles, emphasizing important aspects. Discuss the concordances and discrepancies with other findings already published. The limitations of the study should be clarified.

4 Conclusion/Final Notes

Submit a set of conclusions more important, resuming the initial objectives presented in the introduction. Emphasize and recommend according to the results obtained, new suggestions and improvement that contemplate the object of study. In studies of a **qualitative nature** refer to section of **Final Notes**, synthesizing the objectives achieved.

All references must submit the DOI when applied.

2.3 ARTICLE REVIEW:

Studies that represent a critical and systematic synthesis of the literature on the knowledge produced about a given topic. The method used should be described in a detailed manner, indicating the search process on the basis of data, the criteria used for the selection and classification of primary studies included. The rigor in the conduct of research should be guided by relevant question for the area covered and reflect on the production of innovative knowledge. Stand between recommended methods: a systematic review with or without meta-analysis and integrative review with or without meta-synthesis. In the elaboration of systematic reviews and meta-analyses we recommend the use of the checklist and flow chart as the criteria PRISMA - Preferred Reporting Items for Systematic Reviews and Meta-Analysis (available on <http://www.prisma-statement.org>). Narrative reviews will only be accepted if motivated by innovative and emerging themes at the discretion of the editorial board. Not be accepted outdated reviews or studies that include review studies that deal with the results of the review itself, a time which revisions are not primary studies.

All references must be the DOI when applied.

2.3 CASE REPORT/CASE SERIES:

It is intended that the dissemination of reports and descriptions of pathological cases with justified reason of publication (rare, unusual, therapeutic innovations, among others) involving the area of Health Sciences.

Must present the **Introduction** containing the justification of the theme and specificities of the same, the **Description** of the case, the **Discussion** presenting the interpretative analysis of results, based on literature, emphasizing the new information and conclusion.

References (see item 3)

All references must be the DOI when applied.

2.4 REVIEW:

It is intended that the disclosure of a text of a critical analysis about a published book that is related to the field of science, printed in the past two years, whose text should not exceed 1500 words. The authors of the review should include at the beginning of the text the complete reference book. All references must follow the Uniform Requirements of Vancouver (see item 3) and submit the DOI when applied.

2.5 COMMENTS

It is intended to debate current issues and interesting about science, allowing the discussion of the subject relevant. The text should contain up to 2000 words (excluding abstracts, tables and references), organized in topics highlighting in the introduction to the subject and its importance. Number of table/figures should not exceed 5. The summary should be in narrative format with up to 150 words. Cited references should be current and give support to the main points raised in the article.

All references must present the DOI when applied.

3. REFERENCE NORMS

— The works must reference the appropriate and relevant literature, which embases statements presented. Citations excessive and inappropriate, or coordinated efforts of various authors to collectively reference themselves, they are extremely discouraged.

— Any statement in the manuscript that is based on external sources of information (for example, new ideas or findings that are not of the authors themselves, or information of general knowledge) must submit the proper reference.

— Authors should avoid indirect citations of an original work. Thus, it should refer to the original work, instead of a review, for example, which cites the original work.

— The authors should ensure that its references are accurate (i.e., should ensure that the reference corroborates the idea exposed in the manuscript, and should not distort the idea of any other work, quoting him, if he does not support the point of view that the authors advocate).

— The authors should not quote works that they didn't read.

— The authors must not give preference to quotes from their own work, friends, institutions or research groups to which they are linked.

— The authors should choose to cite studies from several countries

— Authors should avoid an excessive number of references to serve a same point of view.

— Ideally, the authors should, whenever possible, cite works that have passed through the peer review process.

— The authors should not cite advertisements or advertising reports.

— References should be presented at the end of the manuscript, in the same order in which they are mentioned in the text, and in accordance with the Vancouver Norms: http://www.nlm.nih.gov/bsd/uniform_requirements.html

All references must present the DOI when applied.

4. SENDING THE MANUSCRIPT
